

Getting Started with Google Drawings

Google Drawings lets you create images, word art, objects, and diagrams. Drawings can be used individually or added to documents, spreadsheets, or presentations.

Examples of how instructors can use Google Drawings:

- Create images and objects to use with SMART Boards
- Have students edit or label drawings to demonstrate what they know about a topic

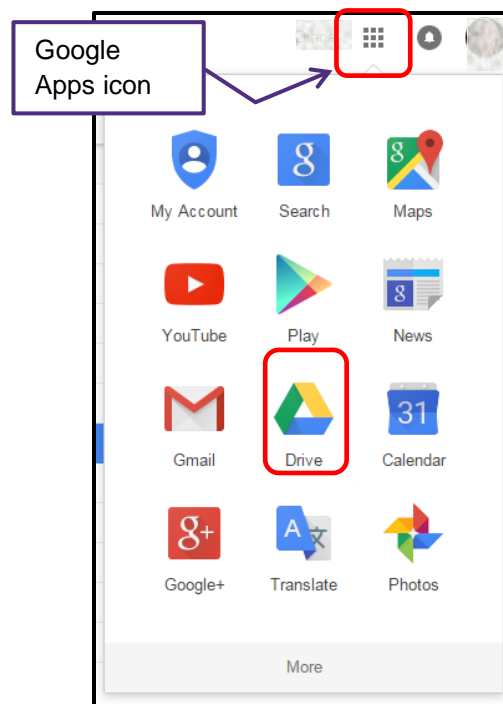
Examples of how students can use Google Drawings:

- Create a diagram to help visualize a concept, key points, or plan tasks
- Enhance a document or presentation with a diagram, image, or object or word art
- Enhance a spreadsheet with a diagram

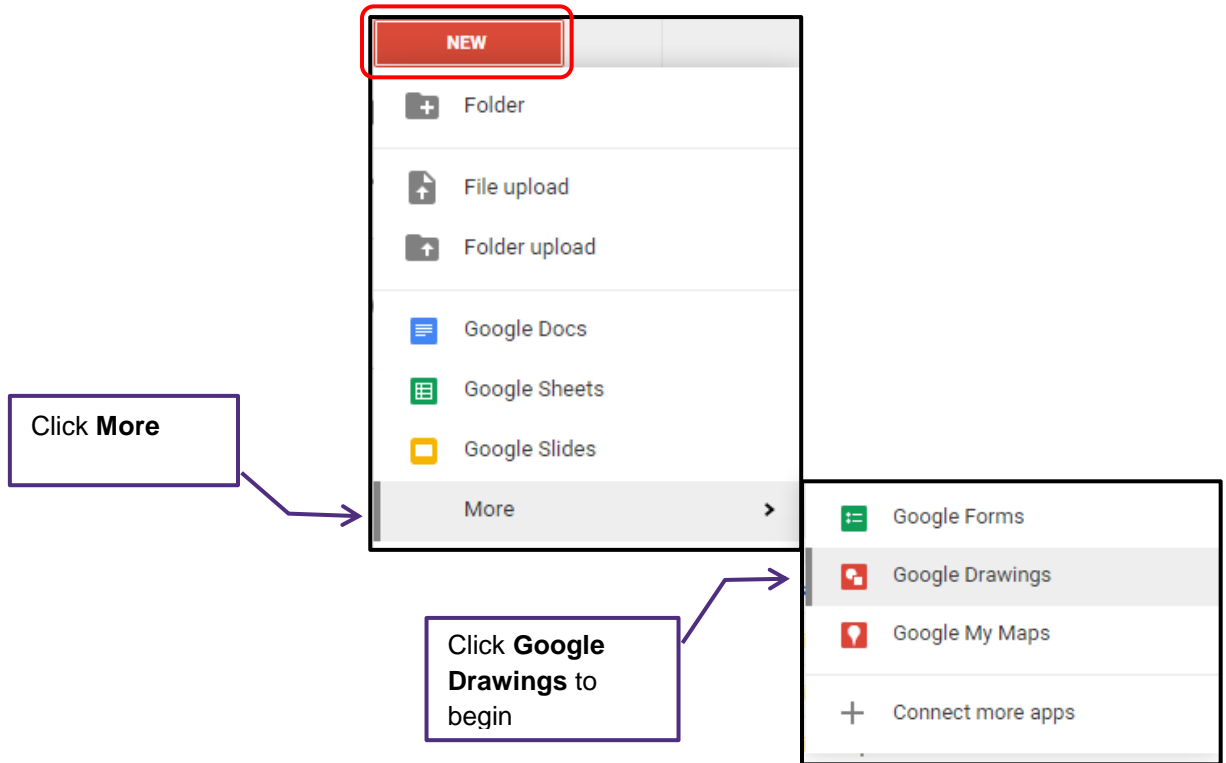
Getting started with Google Drawings (must have a Google account):

1. Open your web browser. Navigate to <https://drive.google.com>

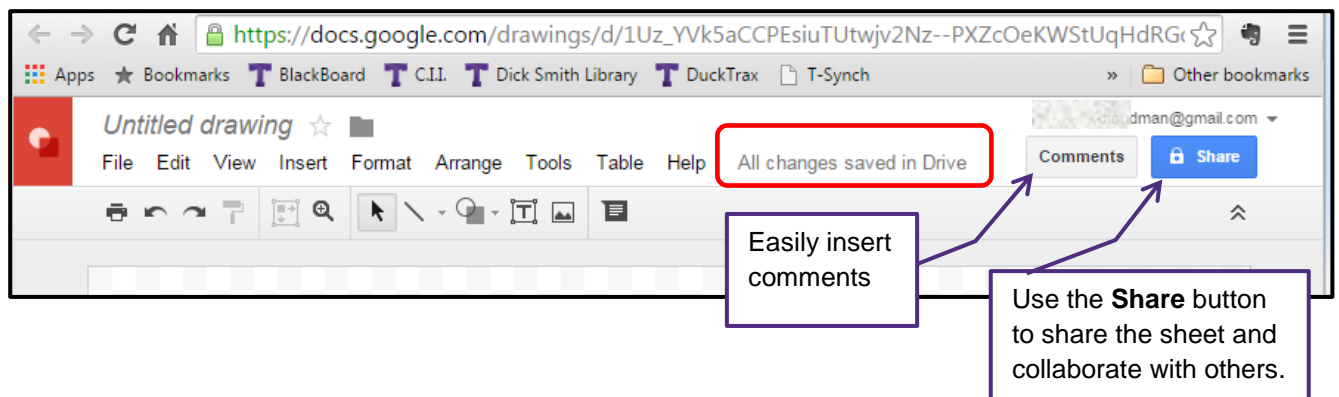
or, if logged in to Google, click the **Google Apps** -> **Drive**



2. Click **New** -> **More** -> **Google Drawings**



3. Note that all changes are automatically saved as you work.
