

## Getting Started with Google Scholar

Google Scholar provides a simple way to search for scholarly literature across disciplines. Sources include articles, theses, books, abstracts, and court opinions and are ranked by weighing the full text of each document, where it was published, who it was written by, as well as how often and how recently it has been cited in other scholarly literature.

### Examples of how instructors can use Google Scholar:

- Locate relevant work among scholarly research
- Keep up with recent developments in any area of research
- Check who is citing your publications

### Examples of how students can use Google Scholar:

- Find reliable and relevant sources for research projects
- Explore related works, citations, authors, and publications
- Locate the complete document through your library or on the web
